If you have the following qualifications we would like to hear from you: you should be at least 18 years of age and be able to converse in English and German. You should be familiar with the Rocky Mountains and Western Canada, have a valid Class 4 drivers license (driving commercial vehicles), minimum standard First Aid, and most of all you have to be enthusiastic about our outdoors, enjoy camping, be in good physical condition and happy to work in a team.

Starting wage is CDN\$ 160.00 per guiding day. Our guides work an average of 65 days throughout the summer from mid June to mid September.

For new guides we sponsor an eight to ten day training course at our base and in the Rockies.

You should apply as early as possible for this summer job.

Guides who want to work in the Rocky Mountain National Parks need a tour guide certificate. We help you with the registration and the details.
